The Forward Book of Poetry 2015 brings together a selection of the best poetry published in the British Isles over the past year. It features all the shortlisted entries for the prestigious Forward Prizes for Poetry, highly commended poems and a foreword by the Chairman of the judges, the historian and broadcaster Jeremy Paxman.

The judges, singer-songwriter Cerys Matthews and poets Dannie Abse, Vahni Capildeo and Helen Mort considered 170 collections of poetry and 254 single poems. Their recommendations give a strong sense of the variety, vitality and wit present in poetry today, making this anthology valuable both to first-time poetry readers and to those looking for new poetry to enjoy.

The three Forward prizes are unique in honouring both the work of established poets (Best Collection £10,000) and the debuts of brilliant unknowns (Felix Dennis prize for Best First Collection £5,000). The Best Single Poem award (£1,000) is a prize for which only award-winning poems and published works not yet collected in book form are eligible.

The shortlists features 16 intriguing and engaging voices; a former machine-gunner, a National Health Service doctor, a Black Country "wench" set on redeeming her much-mocked dialect and a Jamaican who uses Rastafari "dread-talk" to unravel the island's colonial past. The highly commended poems include work by Douglas Dunn, David Harsent, Andrew Motion, Ruth Padel and Michael Schmidt. The youngest poet featured is 17-year-old Ian Burnette.

The prizes will be awarded at London's Southbank centre on Tuesday 30 September, at an event described by the Financial Times as "the bardic equivalent of the Oscars". The 23rd annual Forward Book of Poetry will be launched on the same day, with a cover by renowned contemporary artist Gary Hume. The event falls in the week of National Poetry Day – Thursday October 2 – a mass celebration of poetry co-ordinated by the Forward Arts Foundation.
